



## Lecture Program on NEP 2020 by Honorable Advisor to the Education Department of Assam





### **Brief Description About the Program**

He stressed the need for transparent evaluation systems, regular assessments, and accountability measures to ensure the desired outcomes in the education system.

Dr. Mahanta also discussed the concept of PARAKH, which focuses on performance, assessment, review, and analysis of knowledge for holistic development. PARAKH aims to provide a comprehensive framework for evaluating and enhancing the overall development of students, encompassing both academic and non-academic aspects.
