
Rationality of the program

Keeping aquarium fish and breeding them is an exciting activity that brings not only aesthetic pleasure, but also financial opportunities. About 600 species of ornamental fish have been reported worldwide in various aquatic environments. Indian waters have a rich diversity of ornamental fish, with over 100 indigenous varieties, besides a number of similar exotic species bred in captivity. Native ornamental fish available in rivers can be easily caught from wild resources and can be cultivated for aquariums. The country exports fish worth ₹20,000 crore every year. Of this, the share of ornamental fish is about ₹300 crore. There is still room to increase the production of ornamental fish varieties and the importance of successful business in the ornamental fish trade needs to be emphasized. So, awareness and training on aquarium fish culture and trade as prospect of entrepreneurship and employment generation.
