A Report of the Feedback from Various Stakeholders, 2020-2021

Introduction

The term *feedback* is often used to describe information in the form of suggestion, constructive criticism, positive advice which can be used as a basis to improve the teaching of teachers and the performance of students. Gargaon College is one of the oldest and most prominent institutions of Assam. With the objective of providing quality education, the IQAC of the College has developed the feedback mechanism which begins from the process of obtaining suggestions and views from the various stakeholders through a structured rating based feedback form. Just like the previous years, for the academic session 2020-2021 too, the college gathered opinions and views from students, teachers, alumnae and employers for continuous improvement of the curriculum development and enrichment.

Methodology

Feedback on curriculum is collected from the present students through Google form. Google link is shared with the students with the help of technical coordinators of the respective departments. Alumni Feedback was collected online due to covid-19 outbreak. Employers' Feedback is also collected from different employers either in person or online for further action. The teachers also give their feedback through the Google Forms and even during staff meetings. After collecting the information, data is handed over to the feedback committee. The committee analyzes the information and sends them for further action. Further suggestions are incorporated by departments, academic development committee and the governing body of the college.




Alumni Feedback Summary Report 2020-2021:


The IQAC of Gargaon College collected feedback from the alumni through Google forms. Google link is shared with the alumni with the help of respective departments. There are 16 departments in the college and feedback was collected from 585 alumni for the session 2020-2021. It is believed that alumni's suggestions and views are very important for the overall development of the institution.

Alumni's views and suggestions were collected through nine questions which fall into the following categories:

- The usefulness of the courses in terms of employability or higher studies.
- Updating of syllabus and relevance of course contents.
- Quality of teachers with regard to subject knowledge, preparation and communication style.
- Mentoring, sports and infrastructural facilities, etc.









Question 2: Courses in the programme are appropriate and relevant

Question 4: Help to go for higher studies/ career planning












Question 3 Teachers' Subject knowledge and Expertise









The first question was asked was whether the courses provided at various departments in Gargaon College were useful in real life. The findings show that about 97.1% of the respondents found it useful and marked it between 'good' to 'excellent' in the scale. It is also observed that around 96% added to the view that the courses are useful for employment and entrepreneurship. With regard to the updating of the syllabus, 93% of the respondents found it very good and satisfactory.

When opinions were asked about teachers' subject knowledge, about 96% of the respondents have confidently agreed with 'excellent', 'very good' and 'good' in the scale of



measurement and only 4% mentioned 'not satisfactory'. It is also observed that 98% respondents confidently shared the view that the teachers have good communication style and teaching methodology. Also, 97% of the respondents suggested that the Continuous Internal Assessment is an instrument of continuous learning and progress for students.

The respondents also gave their feedback about mentoring facilities of the college. It is observed that about 98% of the respondents expressed that the mentoring facilities at the college were very useful as they referred to it as 'very useful' and 'useful'. Further, 99% of the respondents emphasized that the other facilities to help learning, teaching, evaluation and research at college were useful.



Employers' Feedback Report 2020-2021


Employers' feedback was collected for examining the quality of the alumni who were serving in different organizations/companies under both government and private sector. For this purpose, a list of alumni who were employed was prepared by the respective departments and emails and addresses of the employers were collected. Then a structured feedback form was sent to the employers through emails requesting to send back the filled in forms.

•	Interview performance









Question 2:Aptitude Skills









Question 5: Subject Knowledge






Question 10: Course Content is Relevant and Need-Based:






Question 11: Course content has enough scope for development of analytical, logical, technical and creative skills of the students




Question 12: Course activities are relevant for development of various skills for employment and self- employment




Question 13: Curriculum designed in accordance with the needs of the industry and market






Question 14: The overall design of the curriculum

The respondents suggested that about 75% of the students had excellent communication skills while the rest satisfied their expectations. When it came to the presentation of their ideas, 77% of the students were able to perform outstandingly while the remaining students fitted the expectation of the recruiters.

While evaluating the aptitude of the students, it was observed that about 90% of the students had a very good attitude and the rest managed to satisfy the expectation of the recruiters.

The study also revealed that 94% of the students were sound in the area of subject knowledge whereas the rest revealed a lack of understanding in their disciplines.

The performance of the students was impressive in interviews with 86% of them exceeding the expectations of the recruiters whereas the rest just satisfied them. When it came to behaviour, it was found that 96% of the students had the right skill while the remaining 4% of the students were found lacking in it.



STUDENTS' FEEDBACK REPORT: 2020-2021

Now-a-days students' feedback has become a widely used method to evaluate and improve the academic and administrative activities of an institution. IQAC, Gargaon College prepared a feedback mechanism to obtain the outlook and attitude of the students for the academic session 2020-2021. In this regard, IQAC prepared a questionnaire through Google Form to collect the information from the students.

The questions were mainly based on students' satisfaction towards-

- ➤ Teaching Methodologies & Assessment Strategies
- Learning Resources, Facilities and Guidance






Question 1: How do you rate the syllabus of the course that you have gone through in relation to the expected outcome of the course?



Question 2: How do you rate the allocation of credits and hours to the courses?




Question 3: Syllabus of each course covers recent trends and developments







Question 4: How do you rate the various papers in terms of their relevance to the specialization streams?




Question 5: Teaching methods followed by teachers:




Question 6: The objectivity of assessment and evaluation:




Question 7: The provisions that are available for student's accompaniment in the college




Question 8: How do you rate learning resources that are available in the college (Library, Lab, ICT Provisions and others)?

The survey shows that about 92% students emphasized that they had 'good' to 'excellent' expected outcome from the courses they have studied and about 94% of them rated the allocation of credits and hours to the courses as good and excellent. About 97% of the students responded good to excellent to the question on the various papers in terms of their relevance to the specialization streams whereas only 3% of the students recorded that the relevance was poor and average.

It is observed that about 96 % of students who participated in the survey opined that the methodologies used by the teachers were good to excellent whereas the remaining 4% of them noted that they were poor and average. About 90% of the students appreciated the objectivity of assessment and evaluation while the remaining 10% of them expressed that it was average and poor.

Around 80% of the students expressed that the learning resources which are available in the college (Library, Lab, ICT Provisions and others) were excellent and the remaining 20% of them expressed their dissatisfaction. There was also a similar response of satisfaction, that is around 85% when it came to various provisions of extension and co-curricular activities of the college while the remaining 15% of them showed dissatisfaction.



Feedback Report from Teachers, 2020-2021





Question 1: Course Content is Relevant and Need-Based







Question 2: Course objectives are well-defined and clear to staff and students



Question 3: Course Content has enough scope for development of analytical, logical, technical and creative skills of the students









Question 5: The course/syllabus has good balance between theory and lab work



Question 6: Courses motivate students to use various resources that are available in the college and outside for their effective learning




Question 7: The Curriculum design, Teaching-Learning-Assessment and Examination are effectively carried out on time






Question 8: The assessment and evaluation system objectively measures the graduation outcome.




Question 9: The curriculum contains a wide range of courses under choice based credit system






Question 10: The College has enough relevant resources which are updated regularly for teaching learning purposes




Question 11: The academic freedom and opportunity that are available for curriculum development, administration and evaluation in the college is

The overall impression of the faculties on curriculum and related aspects was excellent as 100% of the faculty members who participated in the conduct of feedback confidently expressed that the course content was relevant and need-based and that the syllabi were well-designed and had utmost clarity.
