❖ **DATE:** 7th August, 2020

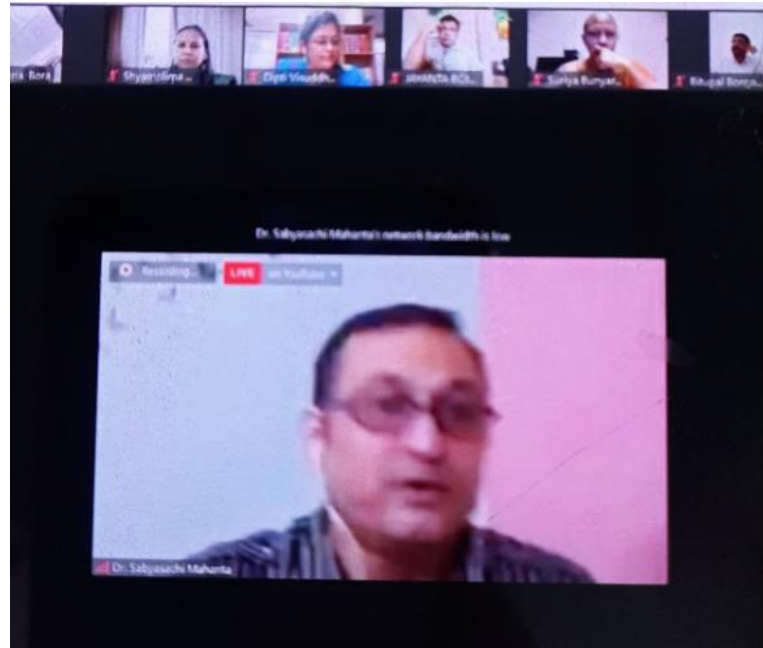
❖ **OBJECTIVE:** To acquaint students with the concept of Feminism, Gender Equality and Women's Movement and create awareness on the issues associated with the same.
